Greetings from the Board!

It's been an eventful few months at UUYO. Matt's departure is now imminent. His last day with us is July 16th, when he will share a service with our new minister, Rev. Joseph Boyd as Joseph takes over the ministerial helm at UUYO. Joseph will arrive around July 1, so there will be a bit of overlap where we will have both ministers with us. The Board sees this as a rare opportunity to have a transition that does not include a gap between ministers. Historically there have been extended search periods, but because we had great direction from our UUA Central East Region Congregational Life Staffer, Rev. Renee Ruchotzke, and enthusiastic participation from our search committee led by Molly Toth, we were able to time everything just right and find in Joseph what we hope will be a great fit with our community.

As I write this, both Matt and Joseph are at General Assembly in New Orleans and the voting for UUA president is progressing. I don't know yet who will win, but by Sunday morning June 25 the decision should be finalized and announced. I'm sure Matt and Joseph, as well as Jim Rogers who is also in New Orleans for GA, will have great stories to tell of the experiences they have had and what they've learned at GA, so be sure to check in with each of them when you see them and find out what GA is like if you've never been.

The Board has prioritized the re-formation of a finance committee that has been absent from UUYO for the last several years. I'd like to thank Ellen Satre, Gene Pusateri, Audra Carlson, Lukas Darling, and Lisbet White for stepping up to help with this important planning team at UUYO. I also encourage each of us to be open to the feedback provided by the finance committee and the activities they initiate to support UUYO's mission and existence. We need this group to organize our stewardship program, capital campaign, and annual budget establishment. The finance committee also helps support the efforts of our treasurer when key decisions need to be made.

Don't forget, we are planning an evening get-together at UUYO as a send-off for Matt and Liz and everyone at UUYO is invited. It will be Friday evening, July 14, 2017. Watch your weekly updates for more information. This will be a great

opportunity to acknowledge the many contributions of both Matt and Liz to UUYO and to wish them well as they relocate to Mexico for the next phase of their lives and careers. We hope that UUYO has been a positive and loving experience for Matt and Liz as I know it has been for me and hopefully each of you as well. Thank you!

Matt's Musings

This is my last newsletter column for you at UUYO - the last of almost a hundred monthly columns.

In a few weeks, Liz and I will load a truck with what remains of our belongings (we've sold or given away much) and our dog and drive to North Carolina, where most of those belongings will be stored with friends. Then we will drive a carload of stuff (and our dog) to Houston where I will spend a week with the ministers and staff of First UU Houston. The Houston church is a multi-site church, and my ministry in Mexico will be an experiment with delivering multi-site church even farther afield. After Houston, we will make a day's drive to the border, and two days' drive later, we will arrive in Ajijic, Jalisco, where the Lake Chapala UU Fellowship awaits me. I will be the first professional minister for this ten year old congregation.

Though I look forward to the next phase of my ministry with excitement, I look back on my time in Youngstown with great fondness. You are a strong, healthy congregation. You treated me, a brand new minister, with kindness, and together we grew in many ways. In addition to numerical growth, the makeup of the church grew younger, with more children in a strong Religious Education program. We grew deeper spiritually, more welcoming of people with differing beliefs, backgrounds, orientations, and practices. We grew more organized, adding year-round worship, worship associates, and hospitality teams, among other programs. We grew more engaged in the community, becoming more than ever a beacon of hope for religious progressives in the valley.

Certainly there have been setbacks, and surprises, and unfinished goals. Ministry is like that. And yet, my heart is warmed with rich memories of UUYO, of your lives and stories, of us doing ministry together.

I had a chance to meet Rev. Joseph Boyd at our General Assembly in New Orleans.

He is impressive. I am confident he will be able to do great things with you, things I could only imagine. I am grateful that Joseph and I will have a few weeks together for a time of transition. Such an opportunity is rare in our ministry, and I hope this overlap will make the transition smooth and effective.

Goodbyes are hard. I will miss you. Even though I won't be in individual contact, I do want to know how you are doing. I'll continue to follow you from a distance. Although I don't yet have plans for public postings in social media, I'm sure that will come together, and those that are interested can follow my progress. Even though we will not be connected in day-to-day life, I am gladdened that we remain connected through the larger faith that is Unitarian Universalism, and in its affirmation of what is good and true and sacred.
